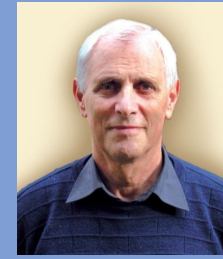

ONNO VAN DER HART, PHD

Onno van der Hart, PhD, psychologist and researcher, is Emeritus Professor of Psychopathology of Chronic Traumatization at the Dept of Clinical and Health Psychology at Utrecht University, the Netherlands, a psychotherapist at the Sinai Center for Mental Health, Amstelveen, and a clinical consultant of the Center for Post-trauma Therapy and Trauma Education, Helsinki and Oulu, Finland. He served as Chief of Research at the Cats-Polm Institute in Zeist and is a scholar in Pierre Janet Studies.

He specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of complex trauma-related disorders, and presents workshops on complex PTSD, dissociative disorders, phase-oriented treatment of chronic traumatization, and family therapy.

Twice he has been the recipient of the Milton Erickson Award for Excellence in Scientific writing from the American Society of Clinical Hypnosis, three times the Pierre Janet Writing Award for best writing on dissociation from the International Society for the Study of Trauma and Dissociation (ISSTD), and the Lifetime Achievement Award from ISSTD.

Dr van der Hart is Past-President of ISTSS, a former Vice-President and Fellow of the International Society for the Study of Dissociation and Fellow of the American Society of Clinical Hypnosis (ASCH). He has published several books in the area of trauma and dissociation, loss, and bereavement, and over 100 articles in peer-reviewed scientific journals.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Trauma-related dissociation often results from childhood abuse and neglect from caregivers. The theory of Structural Dissociation proposes that the personality can divide into dissociative parts, with one or more Apparently Normal Parts (ANPs) engaged in daily living, and with one or more Emotional Parts (EPs) that hold the traumatic memories which are subsequently re-experienced and reenacted. Treatment not only has to deal with the trauma of the abuse and neglect by the caregiver, but the traumatic attachment to them.

Clients often have conflicting emotions and perceptions about their abusers, with some parts having an idealized view while other parts fearing and/or hating them. Other parts can have a positive attachment to their perpetrator and not acknowledge the abuse. Other parts will imitate the perpetrator and reenact the abuse with the parts that underwent the original abuse.

This workshop will focus on core concepts for treating a traumatic attachment to a perpetrator, and how to apply these principles within an EMDR therapy framework. Video clips of actual sessions will be presented. Note: These video segments will show actual sessions of clients who have been sexually abused, including strong emotional reactions to their abuse that are processed to resolution.
